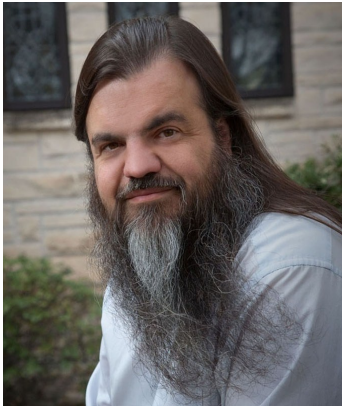

Rebooting the Crystal Ball: Looking into the Future of Higher Education

While it is difficult to accurately predict the future of education, we can make better decisions by improving our ability to think through possible futures. We begin this session with an overview of futures methods, including trend analysis, the Delphi method, prediction markets, and scenario. We then delve into examples generated by each method, comparing what they teach us about the different ways higher education can change over the next decade. A concluding session involves the audience in trend identification and scenario reflection.

Bryan Alexander is senior fellow at the National Institute for Technology in Liberal Education (NITLE). He researches, writes, and speaks about emerging trends in the integration of inquiry, pedagogy, and technology and their potential application to liberal arts contexts.
