
Covid-19 Vaccine in Massachusetts - REMINDER

Per information from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health: Due to high demand and constrained vaccine supply, COVID-19 Vaccination appointments are limited. More appointments will be available based on supply from the Federal Government. Appointments will be added on a rolling basis.

Hopkinton Public Library:

The library plans to resume limited walk-in browsing hours in the middle of next week. The exact date will depend on the weather forecast; please check the library website or social media for updates. Walk-in hours will be from 1-4 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, and from 10 am-12:30 pm on Wednesday. Curbside pickup and other remote services will continue to be available from 10-4:30 on Mondays/Wednesdays/Fridays and from 10-7 on Tuesdays/Thursdays.

Hopkinton Town Hall reopened to the public as of Monday August 10th. Appointments are required due to the state's COVID-19 limits on building occupancy: <u>click here for more information</u>. All town departments are open for business and many transactions can be completed online. We are available via phone and email to assist during regular business hours.
