Parents will receive communication from the College early next week on where to download the App, how to launch it on your android or Apple device and a series of frequently asked questions.



#### Positive Behaviour Support (College Wide Expectations) - Part 9

Dear Parents and Families,

Research has demonstrated that positive behaviour support is significantly effective in minimising and

managing challenging behaviours in the classroom. It reduces stress, frees up much-needed time for teaching, improves overall student behaviours and creates better classroom cultures.

**College wide expectations** is the eighth Universal of Positive Behaviour Support that we will be exploring. They are a compilation of specific, positively stated behaviours and understandings that become the agreed way of functioning within the College community. These expectations are linked to the vision and mission of the College. They are broadly stated, relate directly to the virtues, skills and capabilities and apply to all people across all College settings. College wide expectations are important for providing a common vision, shared beliefs, language and understanding for the entire College community.



Research clearly demonstrates that expectations have a significant impact on student learning academically, socially and emotionally. Teachers who have high expectations are more likely to enhance their students' learning than teachers with lower expectations. Teachers in an educational setting who work collaboratively to have consistent collective expectations across a school have an even greater impact and influence on student learning and achievements.

College wide expectations involve:

- •Being small in number, with only three to five expectations
- Being positively stated
- •Describing the general ways that people are expected to behave at all times
- •Reflecting the College community's (College, families and parish) philosophy and vision
- •Consistent application across the entire College environment for all stakeholders of the community
- •Actively developing, sharing, discussing, promoting, practising and enacting the College wide expectations.

## Saint Monica

(Widow 332-388)

Saint Monica, the mother of Saint Augustine, was born in 332 of a Christian family of the ancient city of Tagasta in northern Africa. After a girlhood of singular innocence and piety, she was given in marriage to Patricius, a pagan. She at once devoted herself to his conversion, praying for him always and winning his reverence and love by the holiness of her life and her affectionate forbearance. She was rewarded by seeing him baptized a year before his death.

When her son Augustine went astray in faith and habits, her prayers and tears were incessant. She once begged a learned bishop that he would talk to her son, in order to bring him to a better disposition, but he declined,

despairing of success with a young man at once so gifted in the year 388. and so headstrong. At the sight of her prayers and tears, he nonetheless bade her be of good courage, for it could not happen that the child of those tears should perish.

The one reason I had for wishing to linger in this life a little longer was that I might see you a Catholic Christian before I died. This grace God has granted me superabundantly, seeing you reject earthly happiness to become His servant." A few days afterwards she had an attack of fever and died at the age of fifty-six,
