Dear Parents, Students and Friends of the College,

The Principal's Address is the event of this week. This Thursday (17th Feb) a link to the Principal's Address will be sent out to all parents of the College. The purpose of this address is always to inform the parent body of the direction of the College each year. It is an opportunity for me to introduce new staff and talk about various projects, events and programs the school plans to undertake during the year. This normally takes place on school grounds as an evening event during the week, but current COVID restrictions preventing public gatherings at schools mean that I have to take the novel approach of recording the address and sending it out through the internet. This new approach certainly comes with some conveniences for parents, as they won't have to travel nor find a babysitter in order to attend the address, but this novel approach comes with some disadvantages too, namely we have lost a precious opportunity at this time of the year for you to meet other parents, talk face to face with them, meet the Principal and other staff and enjoy real human contact. From the Deputy Principal

On Tuesday 8th and 15th February during our College assemblies, we have had the opportunity for the commissioning of a number of our Secondary and Primary School Student Leaders, whom we have asked to lead the student body throughout 2022. These assemblies have woven in nicely with our Presentation Afternoon on Friday 11th February. This was an opportunity for us to congratulate and acknowledge the individual achievement of our students while also celebrating the achievements of the class of 2021. It was also wonderful to hear the inspiring message from the 2020 College Dux Mitchell Youngman.

I was afforded the wonderful opportunity to address the College during the Presentation ceremony. My message focused on the students being the best version of themselves and the adoption of an *I CAN attitude or Growth Mindset* by students when they are challenged by adversity. As educators and parents, we should be looking for the opportunities to encourage this attitude and mindset in all our children.

With a growth mindset, students are open to new ideas, to investigate, to enquire, to seek to understand more, and to show what they know. A student with a growth mindset approaches new tasks as an opportunity and accepts, while sometimes searching into the unknown can be a challenge, and they might not always succeed but the benefits will outweigh the risks. At school and at home, we can help stimulate a growth mindset in the students, as they strive to become the best version of themselves. By considering the way we communicate with them, in particularly the way in which we provide feedback about something they have completed. Where possible pivot on providing simple feedback like good or bad, this limits their thinking. Instead, when giving feedback encourage children to think about the ways in which they approached tasks and therefore the outcome they have achieved.

Over the course of the first two weeks of Term 1 there has been a specific focus with the Primary and Secondary staff. This has been to develop an understanding of the individual educational needs that student presents with. Staff have been actively moving around the learning environment getting to know each student as well as their unique strengths and areas of challenge. Our staff take pride in knowing their students and work to identify and uncover the different perspectives each child has on issues related to the curriculum. They use these as windows to look through when designing the shape of the learning experiences they will provide for each student.

As students develop and grow in their knowledge, skill and general capability, we trust that they are inspired to embrace a love for learning throughout their lives. Curriculum design at the College is therefore designed not only for the formal arrangements which lead to successful learning, but also the informal elements of the curriculum: what students bring to the classroom from their own lived 'reality' and what occurs instinctively, regardless of what is planned.

Your children are placed at the centre of all curriculum design within the College, an environment where everyone's story is embraced.

SAINT VALENTINE 14th February

Priest and Martyr

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Valentine was a holy priest in Rome, who assisted the martyrs during the persecution under Claudius II. His great virtue and influence became known, and he was apprehended and brought before the emperor's tribunal. "Why, Valentine, do you want to be the friend of our enemies and reject our friendship?" The Christian priest replied, "My Lord, if you knew the gift of God, you would be happy, and your empire with you; you would reject the cult of your idols and would adore the



true God and His Son Jesus Christ." One of the judges interrupted, asking the martyr what he thought of Jupiter and Mercury. "That they were miserable, and spent all their lives in debauchery and crime!" The judge, furious, cried, "He has blasphemed against the gods and against the empire!" The emperor nonetheless continued his questioning with curiosity, pleased to have this opportunity to know what Christians thought. Valentine had the courage to exhort him to do penance for the blood of Christians which he had shed. "Believe in Jesus Christ, be baptized and you will be saved, and already in this life you will insure your empire's glory and the triumph of your arms." Claudius began to be convinced, and said to those in attendance, "Hear the beautiful doctrine

this man is teaching us!" But the prefect of Rome, dissatisfied, cried out, "See how this Christian is seducing our prince!" Claudius, weakening, abandoned the holy priest to another judge.

This man, named Asterius, had a little girl who had been blind for two years. Hearing of Jesus Christ, the Light of the world, he asked Valentine if he could convey that light to his child. Saint Valentine placed his hand on her eyes and prayed: "Lord Jesus Christ, true Light, illuminate this blind child!"

The child saw, and the Judge with all his family confessed Christ and received Baptism. The emperor, hearing of this, would have turned his gaze away from these conversions, but fear caused him to betray his sense of justice. With several other Christians Saint Valentine was tortured and martyred in the year 268.

This illustrious martyr has always been held in great honor in Rome, where there still exists a catacomb named for him.

Reflection. In the cause of justice and truth, human prudence should not be consulted; in that case, it is mere human respect. Saint Paul says: "The wisdom of this world is foolishness with God." *(I Cor.* 3:19)
