Future Stars Tournament

Saturday 8th May 2021

Future Stars is a one-day, three-round tournament for novice level juniors seeking to gain experience in playing long time control games. Players should have **Australian Chess Federation standard ratings* below 500** and be able to confidently move the chess pieces around the board and record their moves. Players will compete in small groups, with ACTJCL coaches providing game analysis after players have completed their games. *A standard rating is an official rating gained from playing games where each player receives at least 60 minutes per game.

Schedule	Saturday 8th May: Arrival - 9.45am, Round 1 – 10am, Round 2 – 12.30pm, Round 3 – 2pm, Prizegiving: Between 4- 4.30pm.
Venue	Campbell High School Library, Treloar Crescent, Campbell ACT
Eligibility	Restricted to juniors born on or after 1 January 2003 who have Australian Chess Federation Standard Ratings below 500, or who have no standard rating. Use this tool to check whether your child has a standard rating: sachess.org.au/ratings/
Time Control	60 minutes plus 10 seconds per move from move 1.
Byes	No byes permitted.
Prizes	The winner of each small group will receive a medal. All children will receive a participation ribbon.
Lunch	No lunch or snacks will be available at the venue. Please bring your own food.
Entries	\$20 per player. Enter via Trybooking at https://www.trybooking.com/BQOSU Entries close Friday 7th May at 9pm. No entries will be accepted on the day. Limit of 30 players.
