Advocacy Guidelines for Coalition Action Teams and Committees

Advocacy is defined as "active support of an idea or cause". The Sustainability Coalition's Advocacy Policy makes a distinction between "public service" advocacy and "public policy" advocacy. The Coalition's action teams are encouraged to participate in public service advocacy, but are not permitted to engage in public policy advocacy.

Public service activities are those that promote sustainability awareness, education and action. These activities are also intended to inform elected officials and members of boards and commissions of a sustainability perspective with the intent of having them give serious consideration to this perspective when they vote or make decisions. However, public service activities do not include taking a position on public policy.

The chart below provides examples to help action teams distinguish between these two types of advocacy.
