# **Loafer Creek Horse Camp with 15 campsites**

## Lake Oroville State Recreation Area

#### **Introduction:**

An excellent horse camp (rated \* \* \* \* = four stars) is on the south side of Lake Oroville State Recreation Area. The **Loafer Creek Horse Camp** has 15 separate campsites, with two horses per campsite. There are 30 pipe-corrals; two per campsite, with one pipe-corral for each horse. Each pipe-corral has a separate feeder. Each of the 15 campsites has a water faucet; so bring your own hose and horse water-buckets. In the center of the horse camp is a building with two flush toilets with warmwater wash-basins; two separate hot showers are available for a nominal fee. In the center of camp is a large propane tank and water-heater for the showers and sinks.

Each campsite has a sturdy concrete picnic table and fire-ring. There is a trailer for horse manure removal, and a dipsy-dumpster for garbage. Bring your own firewood and kindling. There are 3 wash-racks with faucets and horses, plus a round-pen for warm-ups prior to riding. There are *no* electrical hook-ups for horse trailers, and *no* food lockers.

The **Loafer Creek Horse Camp** is at an elevation of 980 feet in the foothills of the northern Sierra Nevada. The horse camp has a mature forest of oak trees, gray pines, and manzanita shrubs.


**Reservations are needed** for the active summer season, April First through October 15th. Reservation telephone: 1-800-444-7275 <a href="www.ReserveCalifornia.com">www.ReserveCalifornia.com</a> For the popular summer equestrian season, it is adroit to make horse-camping reservations about *six months in advance*. Several horse clubs who helped build this excellent horse camp will typically reserve the entire campsite for popular 3-day holiday week-ends. (Deservedly so; these horsemen personally built the camp.) **The horse camping fee is \$45.00 per day.** 

Day-use horseback riding is \$8.00; this uses a large asphalt parking-lot, a mile north of Loafer Horse Camp *(described later).* 

During the winter season, the horse camp is still open, but conveniently available on a first-come, first-served basis, with payment (cash or credit card) at the entrance-station kiosk near Highway 162 (telephone 530-538-2217 for the kiosk) for specific information about the Loafer Creek Horse Camp.








From the intersection of Highway 70 and Highway 162, proceed eastward through the city of Oroville for about 9 miles to the entrance of the Loafer Creek area.

**At lower left** is a trail map of the Loafer Creek area.

At lower right is a detailed map of the 15 horse campsites. All the 15 sites are equal in amenities (pipe-corrals, concrete table, fire pit, water faucet), so the only difference is the topographic parking for horse trailers.









The fee for the Horse Campsite is \$45.00 per day.

Day-riders can park in the northern parking lot for just \$8.00

There are 15 campsites in the Loafer Creek Horse Camp.

There are no more than 2 horses per campsite, with no more than 8 people per campsite.

Check-out by Noon, then move to the (free) North Parking Lot and continue to ride until dark; then depart.

# HORSE CAMP RULES

- I. DO NOT TIE HORSES TO TREES.
- 2. NO MORE THAN 2 HORSES PER CAMPSITE.
- 3. NO MORE THAN 8 PEOPLE PER CAMPSITE.
- 4. PLEASE CLEAN UP AND TRANSPORT MANURE TO TRAILER NEAR RESTROOM.
- 5. CHECK-IN TIME IS 2:00 PM.
- 6. CHECK-OUT TIME IS 12:00 NOON. IF YOU WANT TO RIDE AFTER CHECK-OUT TIME, PLEASE PACK UP AND MOVE TO A FREE PARKING AREA. ASK GATE ATTENDANT FOR INFORMATION ON FREE PARKING LOCATIONS.


**3 Wash Racks with Hoses** 

## **Round-Pen for Horse Warm-Up**

















Bring \$1 and \$5 bills to purchase tokens for the hot showers. There are four tokens for one dollar. Quarters do *not* work; only tokens must be used. One token works for two minutes of shower time.

There are two separate shower stalls, and one is for handicapped people. Bring your own bath towel, bar-soap, facecloth, shampoo, and shower sandals.
