HELP SAVE REYNOLDS FIELD

The Board of Education is considering spending millions on SYNTHETIC TURF for Reynolds Field

These Changes are Too Big and Inappropriate for Our Community Proposals include:

- Nearly \$4 million for a massive field overhaul, including a 6-lane track
- **Synthetic turf**, which gets so hot it would make Reynolds **unusable** to the community during much of the summer, and poses possible health risks
- An unnecessary **press box** and new **retaining walls**
- Tree removal and elimination of grass for parking and reconfiguration
- **Reconfiguring** the **tennis courts**: eliminating part of lower-Reynolds Field

These proposals would turn Reynolds into a generic, mass-produced field space entirely out of character with the village of Hastings. A modern grass field would give our student-athletes the quality field and playing time they deserve, while preserving this precious Hastings resource. **Are we ready to give up our natural, environmentally friendly field?**

- Is this a budget priority given decreasing state support for Hastings schools and increasing reliance on Hastings taxpayers?
- How much does it really cost to **maintain** and then **dispose of tons of plastic** when synthetic turf is worn out in 10 years or less?
- Why would we want to increase our greenhouse gas emissions?

We ask the Board to pause and consider athletic programs, community recreational use, environmental responsibility, and wise allocation of the village's financial resources, then present the most environmentally-friendly, cost-efficient options for a vote in the fall.

Tell the Board of Education that the options they've put forward won't work and you won't support them.
