2. Conference design

The conference design is now with 4 tracks:

- T1) Clinical narratives
- T2) Organizational and community narratives and coaching
- T3) Identity reconstruction after communist regimes
- T4) Research in narratives (the stories of narrative research)

During the conference we will benefit from the participation of Mark Hayward and Vicky Eames with the Narrative Therapy Book Stand.

3. Post-conference

Saturday, July 5 and Sunday, July 6 are post-conference days with a varied offer of activities:

Saturday, July 5

A. SITE VISITS

1 lasi City Tour – will include major city historical and landmark buildings, museums, parks, as well as certain special visits to Psychiatric hospital of lasi, the Jewish cemetery, major monasteries in lasi (it may be segmented in subgroups, according to preferences of participants) – the tours will be guided by volunteers and mostly will be on foot;



2 Bucovina Tour – this will be offered on request – we will hire a bus or minibus for the interested participants; it will include one or two UNESCO Heritage monasteries in Northern Moldova area as well as the some special visits – folk pottery workshops, rural villages, the Psychiatric Hospital in Campulung Moldovenesc – itinerary subject to modifications according to participants' preferences.

B. PARTICIPATION IN Joint Conference: 3rd NTCW & 2nd Social Psychiatry Conference

(Campulung Moldovenesc, 3 hrs West of Iasi)

The registered participants in the post-conference workshop W6 (Hugh Fox) will benefit free transportation from lasi to Campulung Moldovenesc.

A special bus or minibus will transport the interested participants to Campulung Moldovenesc where we will have the Joint Conference: in parallel, W6 and the works of the International Social Psychiatry Conference (in English language).

The special Rustic Traditional Dinner and the hotel overnight will be paid separately (costs to be announced)
