The comment period for 40 Mount Hood Road in Brighton ends on Monday, April 2, 2018. 1650 Commonwealth, LLC (the "Proponent"), proposes to develop an approximately 1.7-acre site at 40 Mount Hood Road in the Brighton neighborhood of Boston. The existing site, located at the corner of Mount Hood Road and Egremont Road, currently consists of a motel containing 74 hotel rooms in three separate buildings, as well as surface parking spaces. The site will be developed into an approximately 163,000 square foot residential building containing approximately 178 residential units with a mix of rental and condominium units, and 142 parking spaces.
