These uses will be designed to accommodate research companies in the biotechnology and life sciences industry. The project is also anticipated to include approximately 22,000 square feet of ground floor retail uses and 40 residential units.

15-35 Washington St have filed their Project Notification Form with the Boston Planning & Development Agency on October 26, 2018. The comment period ends on Monday, November 26, 2018.

The Project will include new construction of up to 270 dwelling units consisting of multi-family apartments, a new approximately 45,753-square foot Whole Foods grocery store, a new approximately 3,593-square foot Citizens Bank, and up to 323 structured parking spaces that will support the residential and commercial uses. Both the existing Whole Foods grocery store and Citizens Bank will be reconstructed on site and relocated into new retail spaces facing Washington Street. The Project seeks to replace what are currently small retail buildings and a large surface parking lot with a vibrant mixed-use development activated by ground-floor retail uses with housing above.

Encore Properties, LLC, proposes a new five-story, 37-unit, mixed-use building consisting of approximately 44,150 gross square feet including 2,000 square feet of ground floor commercial retail space. Its residential component will consist of 100% homeownership units. The project also provides parking at a ratio of one space per dwelling unit, for a total of 37 spaces. It also incorporates a lushly planted garden courtyard along Langley Road to provide greenspace, an outdoor activity area for residents, a new commercial space targeted towards local retail, and a transitional buffer between the larger-scale structure on Washington Street and the town homes on Langley Road.
