The comment period for Allston Yards in Allston has been extended to Wednesday, May 30, 2018.

The Proposed Project will replace an existing retail center located at 60 Everett Street Allston with a mixed use project comprised of residential, office, grocery, restaurant, fitness and retail uses, as well as a new approximately 0.5-acre community green, activated with year-round programming to enhance public use and enjoyment.

The proposed project contemplates a new seven (7)-story (six stories with a stepped back seventh level), 46-unit residential condominium building above ground-level parking for 42 total vehicles utilizing a mechanical parking system, lobby utility spaces and two (2) artists' loft live/work spaces on the ground level with direct access outside; six (6) of the residential units will be affordable.

Molasses: From the Slave Trade to the Great Flood

Author Talk with Anthony Sammarco

Anthony Sammarco will speak on the history of molasses and the Triangle Trade. Massachusetts was part of this 18th century Triangle Trade when rum from New England was traded for African slaves. The slaves were then brought to the Caribbean to work in the cane fields. Sugar cane was refined into molasses and shipped to New England where it was used to make rum. In 1919, 2.3 million gallons of molasses ran down the streets of the North End of Boston in what is known as the Great Molasses Flood.
