# The comment period for 139-149 Washington Street ends on Friday, August 17, 2018.

The proposal includes two new residential buildings the first building will contain approximately 180 rental units with a mix of studio, one-bedroom and three-bedroom units. The second building will contain approximately 30 for-sale units with a mix of one-bedroom, two-bedroom and three-bedroom units.
