Gut Shabbos

*Every Rosh Hashanah, the Velzer Rebbe would prepare a massive birthday cake, honey cake of course, with 5,000+ candles (for the number of the years) to celebrate his and the world's birthday (Hayom Haras Olam). The candles would burn continuously from several days before until several days after Yom Tov. Chassidim the world over would come to participate in the celebration. Most especially, travelers to Umam would detour to or from their annual pilgrimage to stop in Velz, get two pieces of honey cake sherayim and sign Hayom Haras Olam with the special Velzer tune repeating the word "Hayom" twice to achieve the gematriya 122-a segula that the Rebbe should outlive his chassidim. That's why the Velzer chassidim came to be known as the toyta chassidim."-Rabbi Mel Teitelbaum
