

Bedford Town Trail Walk

Saturday November 6 at 10:00 a.m.

Minnie Reid and Altmann/Pickman Meadow

Please join the Bedford Trails Committee for a free trail walk in the woods! We plan to explore the Minnie Reid and Altmann/Pickman Meadow conservation areas. Pace will be leisurely.



The Minnie Reid conservation area offers varied terrain and habitats including open fields, forested hillsides, white pine groves, wetlands, a vernal pool, and numerous edge habitat areas. Mostly wooded, the Altmann/Pickman Meadow conservation area terrain slopes gradually to the Concord River and Two Brothers' Rocks, where Governor John Winthrop and his Deputy Governor Thomas Dudley divided Winthrop's land grant in 1638.

Difficulty Level: Moderate. The walk is about 3 miles and takes about 1.5 – 2 hours.

When and where: Leave from the parking lot behind the Bedford Free Public Library at 10:00 a.m.

Arrive early to sign up for the walk! We'll head over to the Minnie Reid trailhead on Chelmsford Road (route 4).
