This is a compilation of thoughts of what we might need if asked to deploy to provide emergency communications.

Basic stuff to bring:

- Food and Water
- A way to cook food
- Shelter for yourself
- Clothes, including rain coat and sweatshirt
- Medicine
- Bug spray
- Sunscreen
- Flashlight
- Gloves
- First aid kit
- Tools and wire to make repairs

Technical stuff to bring:

- HF Radio
  - o Tuner
  - o An antenna you can deploy in the field. Remember, might NOT have trees to hang it from
  - Cables to hook it all up
- VHF or UHF/VHF radio, something for a base and maybe a portable that can be loaned out
  - An antenna for the UHF/VHF radio, again, need to be able to support it, higher is always better
  - $\circ$   $\,$  Cables to hook it all up.
- Ropes, stakes, poles, string, ties, duct tape, electrical tape, super glue
- Power source: batteries, solar charging panels, generator, fuel
- Fuses
- Pens, paper, pencils, clipboards, blank ICS-213 forms
- Printout of net script
- List of Operators
- Shelter for the station (like an Easy-Up)
- Table and chairs
- Portable grounding equipment
- Lights for night time operation, power source

The "Basic" stuff has a time component to it; deployment duration should be 3-5 days before you can get restocked.

The "Technical" stuff is time independent, except for generator fuel.
