### BIOGRAPHY

Sean is an accomplished entrepreneur who has founded about a dozen of high-tech companies. Currently, he is the CEO of B&W TEK Inc., a leading photonic instrument company producing analytical instrumentation, medical systems and lasers. He is also co-founder and chairman of LiteCure, a rapidly growing medical device company in Delaware. In addition, he serves on the boards of several other privately held companies. Sean has authored many scientific publications and holds 35 U.S. and international patents, with more than 20 patent applications pending in the areas of optical instruments, lasers, spectroscopic sensors, and medical devices. He is a member of OSA and SPIE and a fellow of the American Society of Laser Medicine and Surgery (ASLMS). He is the 2015 recipient of the Presidential Citation for Outstanding Achievement and Contribution to ASLMS. He is also the 2014 recipient of the Delaware Biotechnology Industrial Association's inventor of the year award. He is a member of the University of Delaware's College of Engineering Advisory Council.
