- Teach undergraduate and graduate courses in church music
- Maintain active participation in a local church music ministry
- Build and maintain relationships with church leaders
- Supervise dissertations and theses
- Other duties as assigned, according to qualifications and departmental needs

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Research Doctorate (in hand at start date)
- Established record of or strong potential for widely recognized scholarly research and publication and/or creative activity required
- Previous practical involvement in music ministries of the church required
- Record of college teaching preferred

RANK AND SALARY:

- Tenure-track position
- Rank and salary commensurate with qualifications and experience

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

- Screening of applicants will begin on October 29, 2021, and will continue until the position is filled.
