

Bigleaf Maple



- Medium to large, fast-growing tree
- Height: 50' – 75'
- Has the largest maple leaves, with 5 lobes up to 15" in diameter
- Spring: small, greenish-yellow fragrant flowers, hanging in clusters
- Fall: yellow, orange, or copper leaves

Oregon White Oak



- Medium to large, slow-growing shade tree, with a broad and spreading canopy
- Height: up to 75'
- Spring: small flowers appearing in singles or small clusters
- Fall: yellow-brown leaves; acorns mature in one year between August and November

Vine Maple



- Small tree: single-stemmed in full sun
- Height: 6' – 20'
- Spring: red and white flowers form along branches
- Fall: bright red or orange leaves in sunny, open locations

Cascara



- Small tree
- Height: 10' – 32' / Width: 6' – 26'
- Spring: small, greenish-yellow flowers, appearing in loose clusters; small, bright red fruit quickly ripens to dark blue
- Fall: leaves turn light orange to yellow
