
Recommendations

- Technological and operational solutions that create greater continuity, clarity, accessibility, and transparency for advising and the processing of transfer students and informing course, program, and institution selection among the NCCCS and UNC System institutions, particularly through the implementation of statewide data sharing between the two systems.
- The addition of demographic data to the current transfer data dashboard on the UNC System website so that any inequities can be identified and addressed.

Recommendations

- An examination of policies and procedures as they relate to diversity, equity, and inclusivity among NCCCS and UNC System transfer students, with the objective of promoting equitable outcomes to ameliorate any deficiencies.
- Implementing templates for baccalaureate degree plans that would be recognizable and easy-to-follow for al students, no matter the eventual transfer destination.
- Continuing collaborations with other key partners (e.g., NCSU's Belk Center for Community College Leadership and Research, myFutureNC, North Carolina's Independent Colleges and Universities, etc.) in the work of transfer success.



Initial Findings:

- < 81% of responding CCs offer CAA training to their employees
- < 79% of responding CCs have a direct link to BDPs on their websites
- < 50% of responding CCs document students' BDP selections
- < 37% of responding CCs track students' adherence to BDPs
- < 8% of responding CCs have a direct link to *CAA* appeals info on their websites
- > 55% of responding CCs identified specific challenges with *CAA* policies, institutional procedures, etc.

Baccalaureate Degree Plans

TAC Recommendation in 2021 Legislative Report: Implementing templates for baccalaureate degree plans that would be recognizable and easy-to-follow for all students, no matter the eventual transfer destination.

- February 2022 Series of focus groups held for CC Advisors
- March April 2022 Series of focus groups to be held for CC students
- Summer 2022 Outcomes to be shared with TAC

Focus group participants asked about:

- Familiarity with BDPs
- Ease of Utilization
- Suggestions for Improvement
- Ideal Form and Location of BDPs

CAA Course Updates

In 2021, four new courses were added to the Pre-major/Elective course list:

- CJC 113 Juvenile Justice
- CJC 212 Ethics & Community Relations
- CSC 249 Data Structures & Algorithms
- CSC 251 Advanced JAVA Programming

These additions to the *CAA* were presented to appropriate personnel in both systems, with the expectation that BDPs will continue to be updated to reflect these changes in the next academic term.

CAA Course Updates

In 2022, five new courses are likely to be added to the Pre-major/Elective course list:

- ENG 127 Fiction Writing
- ENG 128 Poetry Writing
- ENG 129 Creative Nonfiction Writing
- TEX 110 Fundamentals of Textiles
- TEX 210 Fiber Science

These additions to the *CAA* have been presented to appropriate personnel in both systems, and we are waiting on feedback from the UNC System Office.

CAA Revision and Language

- The TAC is developing a version of the *CAA* that is more student-friendly in its ability to be read and understood.
- The TAC is considering addressing policy revision with both system offices in relation to several topics, including the following:
 - The gatekeeper for student redress (II.B.)
 - The size and scope of TAC

UNC Common Numbering System (CNS)

- The University of North Carolina Common Numbering System (UNC CNS) is a cooperative effort among all UNC System institutions to facilitate applicable transfer of lower-division undergraduate courses approved in December 2020 by the UNC Board of Governors as an amendment to UNC Policy 400.1.5 Policy on Fostering Undergraduate Student Success.
- The CNS is designed to be a special group of courses assigned a common number that have direct equivalency at all UNC System institutions that offer the course.
- Over 500 faculty members, undergraduate coordinators, faculty chairs, and associate deans reviewed 187 of the most often transferred courses and recognized multiple inconsistencies among the UNC → UNC alignment that needed to be addressed.
- Implementation of Phase I (UNC → UNC) is scheduled for Fall 2022 while work on Phase II
 (NCCCS → UNC) will happen within discipline committees during the 2022-2023 academic
 year.
- A website and searchable database are being developed for use by students and advisors.

Data Sharing

TAC Recommendation

- Implementation of Statewide Data Sharing Agreements between the UNC System and the NCCC System
- Would eliminate the need for institutions to create partner data sharing agreements with each other
- Could possibly automate transfer credit process from 2-year to 4-year
- Provide better assessment of how students do in next-level coursework after transfer
