VIEW POINT: CRR HIKE WILL PUNCTURE BANKS

The markets are likely to take an early morning dip, like the devout take in the sacred rivers. But unlike the pilgrims, who just plunge in and out of the holy water in a ritualistic jiffy, this one might be an elaborate affair, with bears probably wanting to give you a an underwater massage as well. RBI's move hiking the CRR by 0.5% in two stages, is the one setting up this exotic bath for the markets.

The Sensex had broken the 14000 mark to touch 13957 but bounced back 186 points in the last half an hour. The closing , which is an average of the last 30 minutes of trade does not capture this. A recovery was almost on the cards today. But this CRR hike will result in weakness in the banks, which are likely to take a 4-7% hit. Real estate stocks will also fall in sympathy. This will make a dent in the indices. While we would normally expect a late afternoon bounce-back, to take it as granted may be a folly, which traders may avoid. Its time to protect your capital and forget your Valentine for the moment.

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At the street

What should investors/traders do?

I am repeating what I said yesterday.

If you have read it pl ignore this. But if you have skipped it, pl do read this.

First the traders.

- Take guard
- Buy a Put Option if you are long in futures
- A better way may be to cut longs and buy a call. That will release margin money from futures and make you participate in any upward rally
- Why am I asking you to buy a call after selling futures? Well I have seen traders getting back into their futures once they see it going up. The trend may reverse again, making you book further loss. So if you have a call, you don't have to bother.
- Do not hold leveraged positions beyond a point. Don't be an investor in stocks that have been forced on you by the markets.
- Before calling up an expert and seeking his advice, cut you positions in half and then lift the phone.
- Traders who panic early suffer the least
- Deep pocketed traders , who stay with their longs longer, usually suffer more pain.
- Remember, buying a call instead of the stock futures, will initially cost you, but would help you in keeping your losses lower.
- Stocks that don't fall , may do so the next day. So book profits where they exist to mitigate your losses.

Investors

- Want to book profit, do it now. Booking profits is never a bad strategy.
- If you are worried , book profits and losses and sit on 30% cash.
- Don't marry stocks
- If you have enough cash waiting in the sidelines, you can afford to sit tight and do nothing. But if you have large investments in stocks that are in derivative segment, you may consider writing Calls for 15% of your portfolio
- If you are under invested , with more cash outside than in the markets, you are a lucky person. You could step out and buy your favourite stocks in stages.

If you are wanting to ride the bounce back, here is what you should watch out for

- A 50% or more retracement of the day's loss after 3 PM is a strong sign of reversal
- Buying current month calls in stocks that have been beaten the most usually pays .



RBI hikes CRR

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Tuesday hiked the cash reserve ratio by 50 bps to 6% in two stages from February 17 and March 3.

Here is an extract from the press release

"In view of the paramount need to contain inflation expectations and in the light of current liquidity conditions, it has been decided to increase the cash reserve ratio (CRR) of scheduled commercial banks (SCBs), regional rural banks (RRBs), scheduled co-operative banks and scheduled primary (urban) co-operative banks by one-half of one percentage point of their net demand and time liabilities (NDTL) in two stages, effective from the fortnights indicated below:

Effective Date (i.e., the fortnight beginning from) CRR on net demand and time liabilities (per cent)

February 17, 2007: 5.75%

March 3, 2007: 6.00%

As a result of the above increases in the CRR, an amount of about Rs 14, 000 crore of resources of banks would be absorbed".

We expect the bank stocks to take an early plunge in the morning, taking down the Nifty and the Sensex as well.

Across the Atlantic

U.S. stocks rallied to a sharply higher close Tuesday, with the Dow Jones Industrial Average posting a tripple digit gain after a report Alcoa may be a takeover target and news that 3M Co. plans a large stock buyback.

The **Dow** Jones Industrial Average was up 102.30 points at 12,654.85, with 28 of the Dow's 30 components finishing with gains. The **Nasdaq** Composite gained 9.50 points to 2459.88, and the **S&P** 500 added 10.89 points, at 1444.26.

Leading the way higher was a report in the Times in London that two Australian companies, **Rio Tinto** and **BHP Billiton**, could be working on separate \$40 billion offers to acquire Dow component Alcoa.

Shares of the Pennsylvania-based aluminum giant added 6.4% to close at \$35.

The Dow also got a boost from gains in components General Motors $\$ and 3M.

GM finished with a gain of 2.5% to \$36.59 after **Merrill Lynch** upgraded the automaker to buy from sell, assigning a stock price target of \$50. The firm also downgraded **Ford** to sell from neutral, based on valuation. Ford shed 2.3% at \$8.45.

Meanwhile, **3M** shares were climbing after the conglomerate announced a \$7 billion buyback plan. Shares rose \$1.84, or 2.5%, to \$76.43.

Away from equities, the **Commerce Department** said the **U.S. trade deficit** widened to \$61.2 billion in December from \$58.1 billion in November. Economists expected the trade deficit would widen to \$59.5 billion.

Treasury prices were lower. The 10-year note was off 3/32, yielding 4.82%, and the 30-year bond was down 7/32 to yield 4.90%.

Crude futures reversed a steep decline from the previous session as the northeastern U.S. dealt with a flurry of winter weather. The near-month contract finished up \$1.25 at **\$59.06** a barrel. Natural gas tacked on 13 cents to \$7.36.

Prices for precious metals firmed. **Gold** finished the session with a gain of \$1.20 to **\$668.50** an ounce, and **Silver** added 20 cents to **\$13.91** an ounce.

Looking ahead, Federal Reserve Chairman **Ben Bernanke** will speak <u>Wednesday</u> about the U.S. economy before a Senate panel. His testimony will conclude with a speech <u>Thursday</u> before a House of Representatives committee.
