

Recap 2011: Top 10 worst performing stocks

Here are the stocks that registered heavy losses in the Sensex and Nifty in the year 2011

Indian stocks were the worst performers in the year 2011. Bad news across the world and global growth fears kept the sentiments jittery, which led investors to offload their positions and trade cautiously.

Among the Sensex 30 and Nifty 50 stocks, Sterlite Industries was the biggest loser in the Sensex declining by 51%, and the Reliance Infra was the major loser in the Nifty falling by 57%.

If you look at the table, majority of the losers are from metal sector.
