Natural habitat cages offer close-up viewing of some of the world's rarest cats. We are located in Rosamond, California, just over an hour's drive north of Los Angeles on Highway 14. Volunteer opportunities and internships offer training for individuals 18 and older.

EFBC/FCC houses more than 65 wild cats ranging in size from the diminutive sand cat to larger species such as leopards, tigers, and jaguars, as well as our local bobcats and mountain lions. Visit EFBC/FCC and learn more about some of nature's most majestic creatures. Our Amur leopard, jaguar, fishing cat, sand cat, and Pallas' cat breeding programs are renowned worldwide.


