Kocher's research interests

Examining the strategies and impact of grassroots immigration rights and worker rights movements that contest deportation as a tool of social and labor control.

- How do TRAC's quantitative reports rely on in-depth qualitative research?
- How can you use TRAC's data to improve scholarly research, media reporting, and public understanding?
