



Framework for Our Future:

A Regional Prosperity Plan for Northwest Michigan

Through the Regional Prosperity Initiative, the Northwest Michigan Council of Governments is working with local private, public, and non-profit partners to develop a regional resource that will aid communities that choose to address housing, transportation, recreation, and other local and regional issues.

As part of the statewide Regional Prosperity Initiative, the Northwest Michigan Council of Governments will work with the ten-county region of Antrim, Benzie, Charlevoix, Emmet, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, Manistee, Missaukee, and Wexford counties to develop tools and resources for local decision-makers as they work to create more opportunities in their communities. The *Framework for Our Future: A Regional Prosperity Plan for Northwest Michigan* is being developed as a resource that will provide information, tools, resources, and step-by-step action guides that communities, nonprofits, and other organizations throughout Northwest Michigan can choose to use as they work toward local and regional goals.

What is the Regional Prosperity Initiative?

Michigan's "Regional Prosperity Initiative (RPI)," as initiated by Governor Snyder and signed into law as a part of the FY 2014 budget (59 PA 2013), encourages local private, public and non-profit partners to identify regionally aligned growth and investment strategies for Lansing to support, not the other way around. It also provides the framework for all state departments to share common service areas and support individual regional prosperity plans. Bottom-line is that the RPI is focused on streamlining state services and highlighting the regionally defined goals and strategies that will further our region's success. How will the *Framework for Our Future* be used?

The *Framework for Our Future: A Regional Prosperity Plan for Northwest Michigan* will be developed as a resource for communities and community partners. Data and information will help communities supplement their local deliberation and decision-making, and action guides will help to identify the steps a community can take to address a local issue, if desired. **The *Framework for Our Future* and the Regional Prosperity Initiative is not a state mandate, nor does it supersede any local government decision-making. Your community's participation is 100% voluntary.**

How can my community participate?

Individuals, local governments, community organizations, and others can participate in the development of the Regional Prosperity Plan by providing input and feedback at events, online, and at regularly-scheduled network meetings. See the next page for more details.

When will the *Framework for Our Future* be completed?

The Regional Prosperity Plan is scheduled to be completed by October 2014. The public and stakeholders will have opportunities to review and comment on all draft documents prior to completion.
