Dan and Bonnie Beard along with sons Sam and Parker and their wives Jen and Esther, operate Canoe Creek Dairy near Decorah Iowa. Dan and Bonnie started milking in 1983, began rotationally grazing in 1993, transitioned to Organic in 2003 and became 100% grass fed in 2017. In addition to pasture for their dairy and beef animals, they raise hay, corn, oats, rye, triticale and sorghum sudan grass.



At the kick off event the Beard family will show the cow herd and 35+ heifer calves born this spring that have been grazing since they were two weeks old. Dress for weather! Discussion around maximizing the grazing season without compromising next year's growth potential.

Featured Grazer: Zach Knutson

Join Bairet, LSP organizer to learn about grazing groups at the Goodhue Historical Society! We will have facilitated small group discussions, a presentation from our featured grazer, time to connect with other grazers and enjoy the exhibits at the museum! Zach Knutson, of Knutson Shorthorns, is a 4th generation farmer in Pine Island, MN. Originally a dairy, beef cattle were added in 2011 as an integral part of a low input, rotational grazing regenerative farming and direct beef operation. In 2016, Zach spent six months traveling across Australia to learn about the genetics and management practices by work-



ing on over 60 cattle and sheep operations. He brought the lessons learned back to the farm, and in 2020 he started transitioning row crop land to pasture in order to expand the grazing enterprises.
