**Diane Mayerfeld** is the sustainable agriculture coordinator for UW-Madison Division of Extension. Current areas of focus include climate change, working with diverse farmers, and perennial cropping systems. She has a PhD from the Nelson Institute for Environmental Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and researches silvopasture in Wisconsin. 

He is a founder of the Eau Pleine Partnership for Integrated Conservation, a former board member of GrassWorks, and the WI Grassfed Beef Cooperative. Jason grew up on his family's farm in the Driftless Area of Wisconsin where he developed a passion for conservation and how it can be integrated into our farming systems. Jason also owns and operates a direct-market grass-fed beef farm near Stratford with his wife, Jocelyn, and their five children.



Michael Perry is a New York Times bestselling author, humorist, playwright, and radio show host from New Auburn, Wisconsin.
