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How to remove content

Leads have the ability to remove posts or comments in their neighborhood by [reporting content \(/s/article/How-to-report-content?language=en_US\)](/s/article/How-to-report-content?language=en_US) that violates the [Community Guidelines \(http://nextdoor.com/neighborhood_guidelines/#guidelines\)](http://nextdoor.com/neighborhood_guidelines/#guidelines). Content you report as a Lead is immediately removed from your neighborhood unless a fellow Lead in your neighborhood has already voted to keep it.

1. Locate the post or reply you want to report in the [Newsfeed \(https://nextdoor.com/news_feed/\)](https://nextdoor.com/news_feed/).
 2. Click ▼ to the right of the author's name on the post.
 3. Select **Report post** or **Report comment**.
 4. Fill in the requested information.
 5. Click **Submit**.

When should I remove content?

- Only remove posts that violate the [Community Guidelines](https://nextdoor.com/neighborhood_guidelines/#guidelines) (https://nextdoor.com/neighborhood_guidelines/#guidelines) or [Member Agreement](https://nextdoor.com/member_agreement/) (https://nextdoor.com/member_agreement/). Removing posts that do not violate policy is itself a violation of policy.
- Do not remove old or expired posts from your Newsfeed. The Newsfeed serves as an archive of your neighborhood's activity. Older messages are a useful resource for members looking for information mentioned in past conversations or for newer members getting to know the neighborhood.
- For Lost & Found posts that have expired, you can [c \(/s/article/How-to-close-a-discussion?language=en_US\)](/s/article/How-to-close-a-discussion?language=en_US) [lose the discussion \(/s/article/How-to-close-a-discussion?language=en_US\)](/s/article/How-to-close-a-discussion?language=en_US). Closing the post pushes the content further down the Newsfeed as newer content is added.

What happens to the content after I report it?

- If the content you report was authored in your neighborhood, the content will be removed from all neighborhoods.
- If the content you report was authored outside your neighborhood, the content will be removed from your neighborhood and the relevant Nearby Leads will be notified so they can [review the content \(/s/article/How-to-review-reported-content?language=en_US\)](/s/article/How-to-review-reported-content?language=en_US) for their own neighborhood.
