


Crooked Oak boss acquitted

Crooked Oak Superintendent Shannon Goodsell was found not guilty today on misdemeanor charges of attempting to derail a police investigation.

A six-person jury deliberated for less than an hour this afternoon.

Goodsell, 38, had been accused of attempting to derail an inquiry into allegations that a school employee assaulted a student and used racial slurs.

He maintained his innocence, as his attorney claimed the charges were the result of a power struggle with Oklahoma County authorities.

Goodsell has been superintendent at Crooked Oak, a school district southeast of downtown Oklahoma City, since 2000.
