Interested students should take note of the following points for participation in the process:

1. They must submit an abstract of a maximum of 250 words latest by 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2014. The details of the format to be followed are given in the appendix below. Students are urged to submit their abstracts as early as possible clearly mentioning their Tryst ID's.

2. Authors of accepted proposals will be notified by mail by 4<sup>th</sup> February, 2014. The details of paper submission formats will be attached with that mail.

3. The authors of these proposals must submit their paper latest by 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2014.The submitted papers shall undergo a review process which is expected to last for 3-4 days.

Please note that the acceptance of an abstract is subject to the declaration that the research work being presented is original and all sources being explicitly cited.

Failure to adhere to the given format may lead to disqualification. Very important please note that after receiving the abstract entry, a mail will be sent to the participant from Tryst, IIT Delhi saying that the mail has been received. However if no such mail is received by the participant then he/she has to resend the abstract/paper.

## **Abstract Submission Details**

#### **1. Participant Details**

Participants must include their Name, Tryst Id, Theme of the paper Contact Number and Parent Institute in the body of the mail being used to submit the abstract. Failure to mention any of these details may lead to disqualification.

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## 2. Abstract Format

- Abstract should be a summary of the paper and must not exceed 250 words (not including title, author(s) and affiliations). They must be in pdf format.
- Abstracts must be single spaced with a clear line between paragraphs.
- Abstracts must be free of typographical and grammatical errors.
- Tables, graphs, images and references must not be included. Such abstracts will not be considered.
- Standard abbreviations may be used for common terms only. Otherwise, any abbreviation should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word. Abbreviations may be used in the title, provided the name in full is outlined in the body of the abstract.
- Scientific symbols must be spelt out in full English; symbols must not be used within abstracts.

## 3. Layout Guidelines

#### <u>Title</u>

The abstract title should be short, informative and contain the major key words.

#### <u>Authors</u>

Abstract titles should be followed by authors' first initial and last name. Numbers must be used to indicate the author's institution- placed in brackets, followed by city and country (in the order). Do not include degrees or professional titles (e.g. Dr., Prof. etc).

See example below:

- J.Bloggs(1); A.W. Plant (2)
- 1. University of Sand, Sydney, Australia
- 2. University of Sea, Brisbane, Australia

## Abstract Body

(12-point Times New Roman, single-spaced, maximum of 250 words) A properly submitted abstract text will include the following elements:

- Purpose or Aim
- Methods and Materials
- Results
- Conclusion

<u>NOTE</u>: Compliance to the above specifications is imperative — any abstract that does not comply with these specifications will not be accepted for review.
