Delegates from Europe, USA, Australia, India, Korea, China, Pakistan, Brazil and Africa, with interest in World-class Research in the areas of Agriculture, Health, Energy, Environment, Nanotechnology, Climate Change, Water, Policy, ICT and Related Fields have confirmed participation in the Conference.

MAJOR Opportunity Events that are scheduled to take place on the Last Day of The CFK 2012 International Conference (November 16, 2012) include the awarding of Generic/ALL Fields Masters and PhD (FULL Sponsorship) and Masters Research (Partial Sponsorship) Scholarships to successful applicants, the signing of the Scholarship Contracts with The CFK by the Scholarship Winners/Awardees and the launch of an EU-CFK International E-Mentoring Programme titled "Unlocking the African Science, Technology and Innovation Capability". About The CFK 2012 Scholarships

Applications are invited for Scholarships to support Postgraduate Students who will pursue Masters and PhD Courses at Makerere University, Mbarara University of Science and Technology, Kyambogo University and Gulu University.

Scholarship Categories

The Scholarships will be awarded to qualifying students to read for a Two-year Masters (Full funding; Coursework and Research), 1-year Masters Research (Partial/Research Funding only) and 4-year PhD (Full Funding) courses at Makerere University, Mbarara University of Science and Technology, Kyambogo University and Gulu University. In this particular Scholarship opportunity, The CFK welcomes applications from interested candidates from ALL fields of Science: Social Sciences, Engineering Sciences, Agricultural Sciences, Earth Sciences, Biological Sciences and Health Sciences.

VERY Competitive Scholarships will be awarded in the academic year starting in 2012. The 2-year Masters and 4-year PhD courses are FULLY funded Scholarships. A 1-year Masters Scholarship covers Masters Research Funding ONLY. Each FULLY funded approved Scholarship will cover tuition and coursework fees, and living expenses. The Scholarship will also cover books, laptop, and other consumables for the research project.

In the second year of a 2-year Masters and 4-year PhD, a visit will be funded to an overseas CFK Director or some other Leading International Expert in a relevant field, either a CFK Director or another Expert associated with a CFK Director. In all the Scholarships, this visit is for research mentoring and Collaboration. Approval for such a research visit will allow a maximum of 4 weeks stay (in up to two travel periods), to one or more collaborating Experts.

Submission of Application

A Scholarship application VALIDATED by The CFK Secretariat should be submitted by the applicant. The applicant is required to have obtained a First Class or Second Class Upper or Second Class Lower Undergraduate Degree for a Masters Scholarship applicant and a good Masters Degree for a PhD Scholarship applicant. For Masters Scholarship applicant, a Scholarship is conditional on a First Class or Second Class Upper or Second Class Lower Undergraduate Degree being obtained, including in the case where an application is made before the undergraduate Degree results are available. A Masters Research Scholarship applicant MUST have enrolled for her/his Masters Course in the above Universities.

The Chance of the 2012 Undergraduate Degree Finalists

PLEASE NOTE that a 2012 Undergraduate Degree FINALIST QUALIFIES to bid for The CFK 2012 Masters Scholarships (Full Sponsorship) as long as her/his existing/current CGPA is in the Zone/Grade of a First Class or Second Class Upper or Second Class Lower Undergraduate Degree

Submission deadline: Monday 24th, September, 2012 at 5:00PM EST. Enquiries may be made with The CFK Secretariat at any time prior to the deadline, by the prospective applicant. The application is to contain in a three page limit form a case for support for the scholarship, with reference to the Degree the applicant desires to undertake. In addition, one reference letter, a two page CV of the prospective applicant should be included, containing grades obtained.

Whilst The CFK 2012 Scholarships are Generic/Covering ALL Fields, ONLY Scientific Quality and Academic Attainment/Promise will be used in order to assess applications. Scholarship support will be given for areas EXCEPTIONALLY relevant research and investigation themes in the perspective of Social Sciences, Engineering Sciences, Agricultural Sciences, Earth Sciences, Biological Sciences and Health Sciences.

The CFK Scholarships Selection and Evaluation Panel

The CFK has an EXCEPTIONALLY THOROUGH Scholarships Selection and Evaluation Panel consisting of The CFK International Academics and Research Leaders from World-Leading Universities from the USA, Europe, Asia and Australia.

A First Class or Second Class Upper or Second Class Lower Undergraduate Degree for a Masters Scholarship applicant and a good Masters Degree for a PhD Scholarship applicant. For Masters Scholarship applicant, a Scholarship is CONDITIONAL ON a First Class or Second Class Upper or Second Class Lower Undergraduate Degree being obtained, including in the case where an application is made before the undergraduate degree results are available. A Masters Research Scholarship applicant MUST have enrolled for her/his Masters Course in the above Universities.

Conditions of the Award

For the duration of the Scholarship period, the awarded Scholarship will be linked to the course and research area for which the Scholarship was originally awarded and for which the student originally registered for at Makerere University, Mbarara University of Science and Technology, Kyambogo University and Gulu University.

Research/Field work is to be approved by The CFK Scholarship Domains. Overseas collaborative research visits are to be approved by The CFK Scholarships Selection and Evaluation Panel at the latest 3 months prior to the planned visit.

On the 16th of November 2012, at The CFK 2012 November International Conference in Kampala, the approved students shall sign a contract with The CFK, in which the student shall also agree to face a prescribed penalty (including refunding scholarship money) in case of breach of the contract.

Breach of contract includes but is not limited to: not completing required coursework, research, not providing quarterly and annual reports (see below), and not completing the Masters or PhD Degree in the time prescribed.

A condition for the ongoing funding provided by the scholarship is that examinations (coursework and research) and other assignments are successfully passed.

Students awarded scholarships will be required to present their work to the Board of The CFK at an annual Meeting.

In addition students should submit a report on work to The CFK Scholarships Selection and Evaluation Panel at the end of year 1. The report should be a maximum of 4 pages and should be signed off by the student and the local supervising faculty member. At the end of year 2 (Masters) or year 4 (PhD), a more detailed report on achievements should be provided to the Panel, together with copies (in digital form) of outputs. Other than these annual reports, each quarter a report of 2 pages, approved by the supervisor, is to be provided.

The result is not only research and development that is potentially sub-optimal to local conditions, but a frequent disconnect from local decision making that actually delivers the practical benefits. A more insidious problem is the barrier this creates to Africa playing its full part in the global knowledge pool.

Justification and Strategy of The CFK: In the developed world, whilst many academic leaders recognize the value added of research conducted in Africa with the help of local experts, there are few effective routes to connectivity and few groups able to facilitate research opportunities de novo. The CFK seeks to exploit this reservoir of interest through focusing on building partnerships that would not otherwise occur between Africans in Africa by with scholars and counterparts in the developed world. The first tangible outcome would be the connectivity between informed, local knowledge-based decision-making with cutting edge international research.
