## **Duties and Responsibilities:**

Applicants must be able to teach a variety of public relations courses at the undergraduate level, including but not limited to, public relations writing, theory, research methods, and/or capstone courses as well as strategic communication courses at the graduate level. We also look for colleagues who are willing to advise the school's PRSSA chapter and/or direct our student-run PR firm, Bluestone Communications.

Candidates who have professional experience or can contribute to any of the following needs in the department would be ideal: organizational communication, health communication, sports communication, or the general education communication course.
