"On March 4, 2022, we entered into a Membership Interest Purchase Agreement (the "Purchase Agreement") with Hi-Crush Inc., a Delaware corporation ("HCR"), and Hi-Crush Blair LLC, a Delaware limited liability company and wholly-owned subsidiary of HCR ("Blair"), pursuant to which we acquired all of the issued and outstanding limited liability company interests of Blair from HCR for aggregate cash consideration of approximately \$6.5 million, subject to customary purchase price adjustments as set forth in the Purchase Agreement. The primary assets of Blair consist of an idle frac sand mine and related processing facility located in Blair, Wisconsin. The Blair facility has approximately 2.8 million tons of total annual processing capacity and contains an onsite, unit train capable rail terminal with access to the Class 1 Canadian National Railway."
