

- **What:** ConnectHome is a public-private collaboration to bridge the digital divide for families with school-age children who live in HUD-assisted housing.
- **How:** ConnectHome creates a platform for communities and stakeholders to provide free and low-cost Internet service, devices, training and other resources.
- Why: All children deserve a fair shot at building a brighter future and achieving their dreams. Without access to affordable high-speed Internet, children from low-income families are deprived of the tools, skills, and educational opportunities critical for success in the 21st century. Our nation's digital divide is particularly severe among the people HUD serves, including families earning less than \$25,000 per year, individuals without high-school degrees, and communities of color.
