The Juanito Pascual Trio features two highly versatile and dynamic musicians, New York-based Jose Moreno, one of the most sought-after musicians in the national flamenco scene on percussion and vocals, and stunning bassist Brad Barrett. The band has been enthralling audiences throughout the U.S. and abroad. The 2014 release "Juanito Pascual New Flamenco Trio" was included in NPR Milo Miles' Best World Music Albums for the year. They are currently preparing to release an EP in 2022 in addition to working on a new full-length album set for release next year.
