The President reported that  $\sim$ 450 delegates had attended the meeting and passed on congratulations to the organisers.

The president then reported on the activities of the society:

- IUCr will form a new committee to develop equity policies and SCANZ will also develop and implement its own in the coming term informed by this and the policies available through the STA and others.
- SCANZ funded two members to attend Science Meets Parliament and endorsed statements about ARC delays.
- The website is presently being re-designed to use the IUCr framework but looks more like the AsCA one.
- SCANZ contributed funds to establish the Brian M Craven scholarship for Aus/NZ students to attend an ACA course in the US.
- SCANZ held a Crystallography School with 90 attendees in January
- SCANZ has obtained tax and financial advice. On the basis of this Council have resolved to engage independent Financial management for the 1987 fund. The roles of the trustees will continue. Decisions will still lie with Council. Regular dividends: fund Maslen scholarships, fully fund schools, fund international invited speakers for SCANZ meetings. The secretary will e-mail all members in New Year and invite input on the final model.
