A Convening: What it is and how it works

A Convening is a gathering of individuals with different perspectives on a topic to accomplish a clear purpose. The intent is to draw out unique individual responses from all participants.

The purpose of this Convening is to identify topics of greatest interest to Land Use Action Team members and to focus our efforts in order to be more effective.

The driving force for initiating this process is the need for grassroots leadership in moving our community toward more sustainable land use.

Convening Process

- 1. **The Order** The facilitator determines the order of respondents to answer the questions.
- Participation Each participant is expected to respond during the first round for each question, expressing their unique answer to the question.
- Interruptions Participants may not interrupt the designated respondent. Listening closely to each person's response is a key part of the process.

- 4. **Taking Sides** During their turn, a participant may not say that they agree, challenge, or disagree with any other participant.
- Own Words Participants must provide responses to the question in their own words without directly copying the positions or words of other participants.
- Time Allotment Participants may take up to 2 minutes to respond to Questions 1 and 2 below. Concise responses are preferred.
- Second Round After all participants have responded once, the facilitator asks if anyone has additional responses. If one person says "yes", the facilitator leads a second round. Participants may pass during this second round.
- 8. **Succeeding Questions** When all are satisfied that the first question has been answered, then the facilitator asks the second question using the same process.
- 9. **Notes** Participants are encouraged to take notes.
- Outcome Participants will receive a summary of take-away points and next steps.

Questions to Be Covered at 6/8/21 LUAT Convening

<u>Opening question:</u> What is your prior connection to the Land Use Action Team? For example, are you a new member or have you been on the team for years? What is one project, if any, that you've worked on as a member of the team? (up to 30 secs. to respond)

Question #1: The Community Sustainability Action Framework that guides our work has the following vision for Land Use: "Corvallis is a compact, resilient city with walkable neighborhoods, a vibrant downtown, and diverse natural areas interwoven in urban landscapes, whose community members actively participate in land use planning decisions." What aspect of that vision interests you most? (up to 2 mins. to respond)

Question #2: During the past year, we have discussed several topics in our meetings. What topic or topics are you willing to work on as a member of a Land Use Action Team work group? Or if you have an additional topic in mind, what is it? (up to 2 mins. to respond)
