



Action Against Hunger (ACF) is a global humanitarian organization that takes decisive action against the causes and effects of hunger and is committed to ending world hunger in all its forms globally including Pakistan. ACF through its Agriculture, Food Security and Livelihoods programs aim to empower vulnerable communities to improve their food security situation. Particularly, we train and build the capacity of small-scale farmers to increase production, from crops and livestock for earning decent livelihoods.

The SKala Project

Considering food insecurity and malnutrition situation in drought-affected areas, ACF Pakistan mission initiated a food security, livelihood and disaster preparedness project titled. “Strengthening Resilience to Natural Disaster of most Vulnerable Populations through Increased Disaster Preparedness and Nutrition Sensitive Emergency Assistance, Badin District, Sindh, Pakistan” in short called as the SKala project. SKala project aims to help drought-affected agrarian communities in 30 revenue villages of District Badin, Sindh, Pakistan. The project will directly support at least 50,000 individuals in 10,000 households of the target areas. The project has four main technical components a) Awareness & Social Networking b) Drought Resistant Agricultural Farming c) Management of Livestock during Droughts and d) Capacity Building of the Local Implementing Partner. The Skala project is being implemented by ACF and the Laar Humanitarian Development Programme (LHDP)” in District Badin.

ACF is going to conduct four different TOTs each training is existing on Five Days Training of Trainers (TOT);

1. Drought Resilient Agriculture Farming (DRAF) Phase-2
2. Training of Trainers-TOT on Community Mobilization and Farmer Field School (FFS) Approach Phase-2
3. Training of Trainers- TOT on Livestock management in drought Phase-2
4. Training of Trainers –TOT on Kitchen gardening and Food processing Phase-2
