SHADOW CONSTITUTION OF TORONTO 350.ORG

Toronto 350.org aims to involve a wider membership and function more democratically than is permitted under the University of Toronto's rules for clubs. In situations where our actual rules and procedures cannot be described in our University of Toronto constitution, they shall be described here.

ARTICLE 1: SUPREMACY

In the event of a conflict between the constitution and the shadow constitution, the shadow constitution shall be considered definitive.

ARTICLE 2: PRINCIPLES

Decisions are made by the people who show up.

People choose their own level of involvement.

ARTICLE 3: ELECTORAL COLLEGE

In the event that a majority of members of Toronto 350.org vote in favour of a motion, it shall be deemed equivalent to a majority of members who are students at the University of Toronto voting in favour of the motion.

In the event that a majority of members of Toronto 350.org vote against a motion, it shall be deemed equivalent to a majority of members who are students at the University of Toronto voting against the motion.

ARTICLE 4:

Article 9 of the Toronto 350.org Constitution ("Precedence") shall be considered null and void.
