Recognizing Portland's current rapid growth and the temporary street use permitting required to accommodate that increased development, PBOT is taking a close look at the requirements for work zone accommodations around construction sites for pedestrians and cyclists. Active transportation road users have expressed concerns with the mobility and safety around construction sites. Pedestrians are often detoured across the street and bicyclists are often forced into the path of vehicles, or averted to streets that lack proper safety. Hearing the concerns and recognizing the challenges of navigating around work zones, PBOT has instituted a resolution brought forward to City Council regarding the policy on this issue. The policy supports and guides the use of the public right of way when performing private development and maintaining public infrastructure. The policy states that the closure of a sidewalk or cycle lane shall be deemed the last resort in the absence of other practicable routing or accommodation options needed to assure pedestrian and cyclist safety.
